DISCOVER THE STATE WATER PROJECT

The State Water Project, with its many reservoirs and hundreds of miles of aqueducts, offers Californians many recreational opportunities. The Project includes facilities for anglers, boaters, campers, hikers, cyclists and much more.

This brochure contains a list of the State Water Project recreation facilities in California. Chances are there is one close to your home or your California vacation destination, so check this brochure when you are planning your next outing. For more information about individual facilities, please contact the appropriate agency.

THE STATE WATER PROJECT

The State Water Project, which is planned, designed, constructed, operated, and maintained by the California Department of Water Resources, is the largest, state-built, multipurpose water project in the United States. The Project includes 34 storage facilities, 20 pumping plants, 4 pumping-generating plants, 5 hydroelectric plants, and approximately 700 miles of canals and pipelines, which includes the 444-mile California Aqueduct.

Its main purpose is water supply—to divert and store surplus water during wet periods and distribute it to areas of need in Northern California, the San Francisco Bay Area, the San Joaquin Valley, the Central Coast, and Southern California. Other project purposes include flood control, power generation, recreation, fish and wildlife enhancement, and water quality improvement in the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta.

Twenty-nine urban and agricultural water agencies have long-term contracts for the delivery of State Water Project water. Approximately 70 percent of the SWP water goes to urban users and 30 percent to agricultural users.

These SWP contracting agencies are repaying the cost, plus interest, of financing, building, operating and maintaining the SWP.
